

Sailing 17 December 2017

Summer Series 6

It was hot today. The northerly wind was a good strength but it was very shifty at times.

In race 1 Kevin Webb, Neil Purcell and Ian Power got a good lead on the rest of the fleet. In the 2nd lap I managed to catch up to these 3 who had been swapping the lead between them. At the final mark the 4 of us were close together. Kevin held onto port tack while we 3 tacked to starboard with me trapped between the other two. I managed to pull clear and tacked to the line but Kevin was aiming for the far end and took the win. I was 2nd, Neil 3rd.

Race 2 was a handicap start which left Kevin and I last to start. Ian Power and Laurie Glover swapped the lead for the first lap. I was able to work through the fleet and approaching the final mark I was just a few lengths behind Ian when he broached in a gust and this let me through to get the win while Bruce Watson was also able to pass to get 2nd. Ian recovered to be 3rd.

Peter Andrews had a stay break on his boat so he took mine while I reefed. He stormed the first leg (photo at foot of page) to get a good size lead. On the 2nd lap Kevin caught Peter and passed and then ran away on the downwind. At the penultimate mark Peter was still 2nd but Tom Clark was on starboard and they collided and locked masts, drifting to the far side. This let Neil and Wayne Carkeek through for the places.

Race 4 benefited the early starters and it was a group of Tom, Terry O'Neill, Ian Power and Laurie that led most of the way with Bruce managing to get amongst them to take 3rd. Tom won, Terry 2nd. Wayne, George Stead and Neil were the leading group in race 5. Tom had another collision, this time with Laurie and they locked masts and drifted off to the side. Wayne won, I managed to hold off Kevin and when Neil faltered on the final leg I snatched 3rd from him.

In the final race Kevin took the win with Terry and Peter getting the places.

With 3 wins Kevin was top boat today and takes the lead in the series with 1 more day to sail. I was 2nd from 1 win and have been pushed back to 2nd in the series. Neil and Terry were 3rd equal.

State of the Pond
