I was having trouble with the rudder, probably due to the transmitter potentiometer getting damp. I pulled the boat out at the mark and had time to try adjusting it, but it still wouldn't settle. It lasted well enough for me to take the win.

Laurie had the same problem later when he was about to start a race. With the rudder going to one side he could only turn one way and it wouldn't go straight for long. I gave him the club boat and took his to try to get it to the path helped by Foster Watkinson trying to push it. The wind died away completely and the rain got heavier (photo at foot of page). As members managed to drift their boats back to shore they packed up and went home.

We got through 3 rounds so scores are small. Laurie was top boat with 3 wins.
