Secretary/Treasurer Report

This year saw the retirement of previous Secretary/Treasurer, Peter Andrews, who felt that his health precluded him continuing to carry out these duties. I took over the roles as from the last AGM, and Peter ensured an easy transition. The records I inherited are of a professional standard, and I want to record how well he's carried out his duties.

One of the activities that Peter did for the club was ordering sail and rudder servos in batches from overseas suppliers. These were on-sold to members at a small profit, benefiting both the club and members. This isn't an activity I've continued because it's time-consuming but also because I think most of us have learned better ways of waterproofing the servos. I'm very happy for any other member who feels so inclined to pick up this role.

At the same time, parts which were previously in scarce supply have become readily available.

The last year has been a period of growth in the number of members and at the end of September membership had reached 24 members including 3 Life Members. This has reflected in increased income through higher annual subscriptions and race day fees. As there were no equipment sales during the year the "purchase of stock" expense needs explanation. The expense represents the purchase of 26 sets of numbers between 0 and 9. New members will be provided with appropriate numbers at no cost but current members will be charged \$2 for each number supplied.

Finally the balance of the bank account at the end of the year is several hundred dollars below the start of the year. This will be remedied when the deposit on the hire of the hall is received in the current year.

President's Report

State of the Pond

This time of the year brings more heat to the pond and this can cause the old dead weed that has accumulated during winter to gasify and float to the surface to catch in keels and rudders. There has been a small amount of that already in the fun days that were between the end of the club year's racing and the AGM.

Early in last Summer Series, the second day, we abandoned racing due to heavy dead weed and almost no wind. Usually the wind will blow this surface scum to the sides and not cause too many problems, but light winds can shift direction and keep blowing it from one end to the other.

Generally, while it may affect the next few weeks, this 'burns out' in a short time.

Buoy Maintenance

Wayne Carkeek drove a project to haul out, clean and replace the buoys in a new layout during the year.

Council Plans

Last March the council dug out the sludge from the forebay at the north end of the pond and cleared the culvert under the road. This greatly reduced the unwelcome smell from the rotting weed that had been trapped there.

This coming year they plan to lay down a new path behind the picnic tables that will be above most of the flooding that affects the current path. This will usefully take bikes and pedestrians where we won't block them.

Their current plan is to remove the path along the pond edge at the top end and put in an area of plants. I have pointed out that these would need to survive salt water inundation and also that heavy vehicles use that area when the forebay is worked on, so they may not action that part of the plan.

Publicity

We gained some publicity with an article in Barker's 1972 magazine and this was added to their web site. Wayne's Facebook page has a regular and growing

following linking to the NZRYS site and hosting many photos of the racing.

Also, early in the year, some of us were sailing as background in the making of an ad, though this was for the USA market.

Racing Report

Twenty seven participated in the seasonal series racing this last year, though there were some who only raced for one or two of the days. Sixteen of those who raced had race wins while twenty one had race placings.

I would like to thank those who did the refereeing, a task which is vital when there are 17 boats in a race and several attempt to get around a mark at the same time.

One day's racing was lost due to lack of wind and abundance of weed. One other day was 2 races short as the wind died. Dividing the total number of Races plus Refs by 160 - the total number of races in the four series - gives an average turnout of 13.7, which is excellent.

Nineteen took part in the Aggregate Match Race Series this year.


George Stead won the Summer Series and was awarded the Whitbread 60 Cup.

Rudder Crossbars



The holes in the crossbars that the club has are too large for the screws that take the ball joints. Here I have drilled a 1.7mm hole which accepts the screw.

The boss is also too shallow so that the grub screw does not line up with the flat on the rudder. The flat could be extended or a packing piece can be used under the arm. Here packers have been made from 3mm acrylic.

A pair of native paradise shelducks (**pūtangitangi**) has raised a good sized clutch of chicks in the park this year. All seven have survived.
