Simon's Alternate Keel

Simon Adamson is a long term member of the NZRYS and is a pattern maker. He has produced an alternate keel bulb that is an accurate replacement for Seawinds.

It had been noted previously that there is some variation, and some inaccuracies, in the standard kit item. In particular, the slot to take the keel blade is slightly offset and is too shallow to give proper blending, it leaves the blade root protruding.

The Readysset bulb is not made of lead and thus has a larger volume to give the same weight.

Simon has spent a large number of hours to produce a far better bulb that can be used on kit Seawinds or as a replacement on Readyssets. It is more accurate, has a better surface finish and it fits the keel blade correctly.

There are a small number immediately available at \$100.00 each.
