The pond level was lower than normal by a few inches today. After sailing I opened the weir gate and found that some of the boards had been removed and that the level was still a couple of inches above the ones that were left (above). As it was high tide at the time the level would continue to drop later in the day. The water was also not moving which indicated the the flap valves were sealed by the high tide. For the last 20 years a chain has been used to stop the valve closing completely and allow it to leak during high tide so that there is a small inflow of water. It seems that the workers have removed this chain. I have written to the council about this.

The weed was also a problem today. The de-silting has probably caused weed to be broken up and float about the pond. A simple windward-leeward 3 lap course was set down the middle of the pond to avoid the worst of the weed. Ten members were racing.

George, Rick and Chris Yates finished in that order in race 4 (above).



Race 5 had Brian and Tom (with 1) take the lead on the downwind (above). In lap 2 George and Laurie rounded the top mark together in the lead. By the finish Rick had got between them to be second.

Daniel Leech led at the first mark and around lap 1 in race 6 followed by Mike, Brian and Chris Yates. Rick took over the lead in lap 2 and held this to the finish and the win with Chris holding on to be second and Daniel third.

George Stead and Rick Royden were equal top boats today with 9 points each. George with three race wins and Rick with one win. Third was Brian Christensen with 19 points and one win. The other win went to John Macaulay.

Just 3 points separate the top three contenders for the series.
