Race 1 started slow with the wind dying towards the first marks. By keeping towards the path Rick Royden held some wind and soon took the lead chased by Bruce Watson and Reuben Muir. Chris Ward was in the lead through the dog-leg (above). At times these four were clustered together around a mark. At the finish it was Reuben, Rick and Chris.

Tom Clark took the lead in race 2 with Patrick O'Hanlon and Rick chasing. After the dog-leg Tom and Rick were side by side but Tom led around the bottom mark. At the finish Tom had to tack to port to get to the line but Rick was on starboard and they collided. Tom did his penalty turn to come in second. George came third.

As Bruce launched his boat for **Race 3** the transmitter dropped its battery pack into

the pond. He managed to recover it but missed the race. Patrick and Chris Yates got away to a large lead in the firt two legs and they stretched this out through to the finish while swapping lead between them. Daniel Leech led the rest for a while but at the finish Rick took third.

The wind went very light going to the first mark in race 4. Bruce led the fleet but at the mark Brian Christensen slipped past and was well ahead on the downwind. With the wind patchy and shifty, plus catching



weed, the lead changed many times. Into lap 2 George held a large lead over Dave Larsen (above). By the finish Dave took the win with George second and Chris Yates third.

Brian led around the first couple of marks in **race 5** with George leading a tight group. By the end of lap 1 George was in the lead. He went on the win while Rick and Reuben worked through the fleet to take the places.



Daniel Leech led in **race 6** chased by Brian. By the finish Chris Ward was leading and won with Daniel and Brian placing. Rick had gone to the path to clear weed. When he threw it back in the pond the mast came out of the step (left) and then when he fixed

this the jib sheet caught.
