Four competitors, including a race committee member is a quorum. The wind was only 4 to 6 knots easterly, so we sailed the final round of the Autumn series while trevor tried out the club boat

The wind did shift and sometimes seemed to be vertical, no matter which way the boat turned the sails flapped, but mostly the wind was moderate and only the rain detracted from the racing. The pond was up over the path so gumboots were required but fortunately the edge was visible.

At the end of last weeks racing there were five boats that could, with a good score, take the series win. The series leader has changed 3 times and now it may change again.

Brett won the days racing with a score of 10 after 2 wins. Kevin Webb was one point behind with one win and one DNF when his sail servo failed in the fifth race. He used the Club Boat in the last race. Just one more point back was Bruce after 2 wins. His boat also failed in the last race.

I managed a win but my transmitter failed in the 5th race giving a DNF. I started with my spare transmitter in the last race but this failed too, no doubt due to dampness. With 2 DNFs I only managed 19 points.

Overall series win goes to Bruce as his score improved to a total of 44. Kevin Webb had led the series earlier, improved to 51 to take 2nd place while Peter Andrews' score of 54 had him hold onto a placing of 3rd.

Congratulations to the winners and thanhs to all who competed to make it an enjoyable series.
