Spring Series flight 1:

12 Members sailed the start of the Spring Series in a fresh, but cold, wind.

I have acquired a weather station that records samples of wind, gust strength, direction, temperature and humidity. I set this up to monitor the wind during the racing and attach a graph showing the wind average over each 5 minute sample and the max gust during that 5 minute. The direction was between SE and SW. Perhaps I can add this to the graph, too.

Match Racing Cup:

They have started doing something about the fountains. They seem to have nearly got their truck bogged down by sinking into the sodden ground, but they did lay out the pipes that they will be putting into the trenches when they can get them dug.

Ducklings are about. Broods of six and nine were seen, though these have now reduced to 3 and 4. Eels, too, have been seen, two fairly large ones. I was feeding the birds after sailing in the eastern channel and an eel took a duckling in front of us. Being shallow, I did grab the eel twice but was unable to hold onto it.

Several Paradise Shelducks have taken up residence in the park, it's been a while since we last had some.

State of the Pond:

I have tested the pond water again so that I have a record of the state of the pond prior to the trenching and associated emptying and refilling from the estuary. I also used the grapnel to drag the bottom looking for the start of weed growth. Often the weed will start to flower in september but I only found a small amount of weak weed. It may be because there is not much nutrient or that the water is almost completely salt-free after so much rainfall. Or just that the temperature hasn't risen sufficiently.
